

- 1. In Mosiah 17:1, circle the name (Abinadi) and circle the word (death.) Connect those two words with a line.
- In that same verse, mark "these sayings" and draw a line from those words into the margin and write:

Mosiah 12-16

3. Now put a square around the word priests and draw another line into the margin and write:

Mosiah 11:5-7

- 4. In Mosiah 17:2, circle and the name
- Alma
- In your CHAPTERS scripture journal, start a page and title it: Mosiah 17–26: PROFILE OF ALMA
- 6. On the right side of the journal under "personal thoughts and insights" draw a stick figure of a prophet and label him Alma
- 7. As you are studying and find things that you learn about him, write it into your journal.
- In Mosiah 17:2-4, <u>underline</u> everything you learn about Alma and also write those things next to his picture in your **CHAPTERS** journal. Things like:
 - One of Noah's priests
 - A descendant of Nephi
 - A young man
 - He believed the Prophet Abinadi
 - Pled with the king not to be angry with Abinadi
 - Escaped from the king who wanted to kill him
 - Wrote down Abinadi's words
- 9. Draw jail bars across all of verse five where Abinadi is put into prison

- 10. In Mosiah 17:6, circle the FIRST he and then the verse above, circle king and connect the two with a line.
- 11. Now in verse 6, circle the SECOND he and then in the verse above, circle Abinadi and connect the two with a line.
- 12. In verse 7, circle the first he and connect it with a line to the word king two verses above.
- KN 13. Write a "KN" next to the numbers 7 and 8 in verses 7 and 8. "KN" stands for "King Noah" and he is speaking in these verses.
 - 14. Mark the reason that Abinadi is "worthy of death" in verse 8.
 - 15. <u>Underline</u> what the King wants Abinadi to do in verse 8.
 - 16. Next to what you underlined, write this reference: **Mosiah 12:2–8**
 - 17. Put an "AB" next to verses 9 and 10 which stands for "Abinadi".
 - 18. Read those verses and mark what stands out to you.
 - 19. Put a big square around verses 11-13 and outside in the margin write: **Like Christ.** Go through those verses and mark all of the things that are similar to when Christ was sentenced to death.
 - 20. In verse 13, circle the words scourged and faggots. Draw lines from those into the margin and write down the following definitions:

Scourged: Whipped

Faggots: Bundles of sticks

21. Write an "AB" for Abinadi next to verses 15 – 19

- 22. Go through verses 15 19 and <u>underline</u> all of the prophecies he said as he was dying.
- 23. Put stars all around verse 20. Mark your favorite parts.
- 24. In Mosiah 18:1 circle the name Alma
- 25. <u>Underline</u> the new things you learn about Alma in verse 1. Add those things to your picture in your journal.... *isn't he cool?*
- 26. Put a check mark ✓ next to the different doctrines he taught the people in verse 2.
- 27. In verse 3, put a square around the phrase:

 many did believe his words
 and then out in the margin write:

they were unblinded Mosiahll:29)

- 28. Circle the word thither in verse 6. From that circle, draw an arrow up to verse 5.
- 29. Put a check mark ✓ next to the different doctrines he taught the people in verse 7.
- 30. Put an "AL" next to verses 8 10 which stands for "Alma".
- 31. Put a big box around verses 8-10 and out in the margin write:

The Baptismal Covenant

- 32. Go through a put a tittle star next to each detail of the baptismal covenant.
- **33.** In your **TOPICS** Scripture Journal, turn to a new page and title it: The Baptismal Covenant
- 34. Now on the right side of your page, write "The Baptismal Covenant" right in the middle of the page.
 - * You can write it yourself, or you can do what I do and print it off in a cute font and paste it on. I have one on my website for you that you can print off just go to the same post you printed this from for the link.

- 35. Write each part of the baptismal covenant (the things you put a star next to) all around the words The Baptismal Covenant
- 36. Then next to each element, write your thoughts about that part of the covenant. You can write things like:
 - Your thoughts on why you think this is an essential part of the baptismal covenant
 - What you think it means in your own words
 - How striving to do this will help us become Celestial (which Baptism is the ordinance and covenant we need to achieve that).
 - How the Holy Ghost will help us keep this part of the covenant
 - What it looks like in our lives when we are keeping this part of the baptismal covenant
 - What you and your family can do to better keep this part of the covenant
- 37. Look up scriptures and find some quotes that teach about what you have studied (LDS.org is a great resource, especially the "study by topic" feature) and fill in the left side of the page.
- 38. In Mosiah 18:12, mark how we can do His work if the Spirit is poured out upon us.
- 39. In Mosiah 18:13, mark what being baptized is a testimony of.
- 40. Every covenant we make has an ordinance attached to it. The covenant is in verses 8-10, the ordinance is in verse 14. Next to verse 14, write:

The Baptismal Ordinance

- 41. In verse 16, put a box around how many people Alma baptized.
- 42. In verse 17, circle what they were called.
- 43. In the footnote, circle footnote 17 a, where it says "TG Jesus Christ, Head of the Church" and then draw a line from it connecting it to what you circled in verse 17.

44. Put a check mark ✓ next to everything Alma did to set up the Church in verses 18-22. In your margin, write:

✓ = What Alma did to set up the Church

- 45. Put a big box around the saying: "And thus they became the children of God."
- 46. Circle the word thus and out in the margin write its definition:

As a result or consequence of all those check marks

- 47. Put morecheck marks ✓ next to everything Alma did in verses 23-28.
- 48. Put another box around all the results of those check marks in yerse 29.
- 49. After Mormon adds this story to the plates, he gives you some prophetic commentary in verse 30, read it and mark the parts that stand out to you.
- 50. Next to verses 32-33 write:

The King discovered them

- 51. Mark in verse 34 where it says that the people departed into the wilderness.
- 52. In verse 35, put a box around how many people left.
- 53. Now go back to your CHAPTERS journal to your profile on Alma. Add more things from Mosiah 18 to your page. Add things like:
 - Repented of his sins
 - Privately taught the people
 - Began to teach the words of Abinadi
 - Taught the people the Baptismal Covenant and invited them to be baptized
 - Etc.
- 54. As you continue reading through Mosiah you will still have more things to add to his profile, so keep your picture handy!
