WHAT IS A DOODLE?

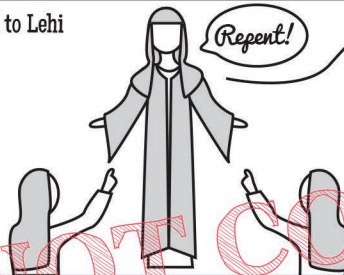

In this chapter, Nephi continues to quote Isaiah. At the beginning of this chapter Isaiah is comparing the House of Israel to a vineyard.





Title for this chapter

Many new branches grafted into other trees.	<p>"Grafting" was a common practice in ancient times where you would take a branch from one tree and insert it into a different tree.</p> <p>One purpose of doing this might be to help an olive tree which was no longer bearing fruit. One would take a branch from a healthy tree and "Graft" it into the wild tree in hopes that it would strengthen the tree.</p>	Wild branches grafted into tame tree.

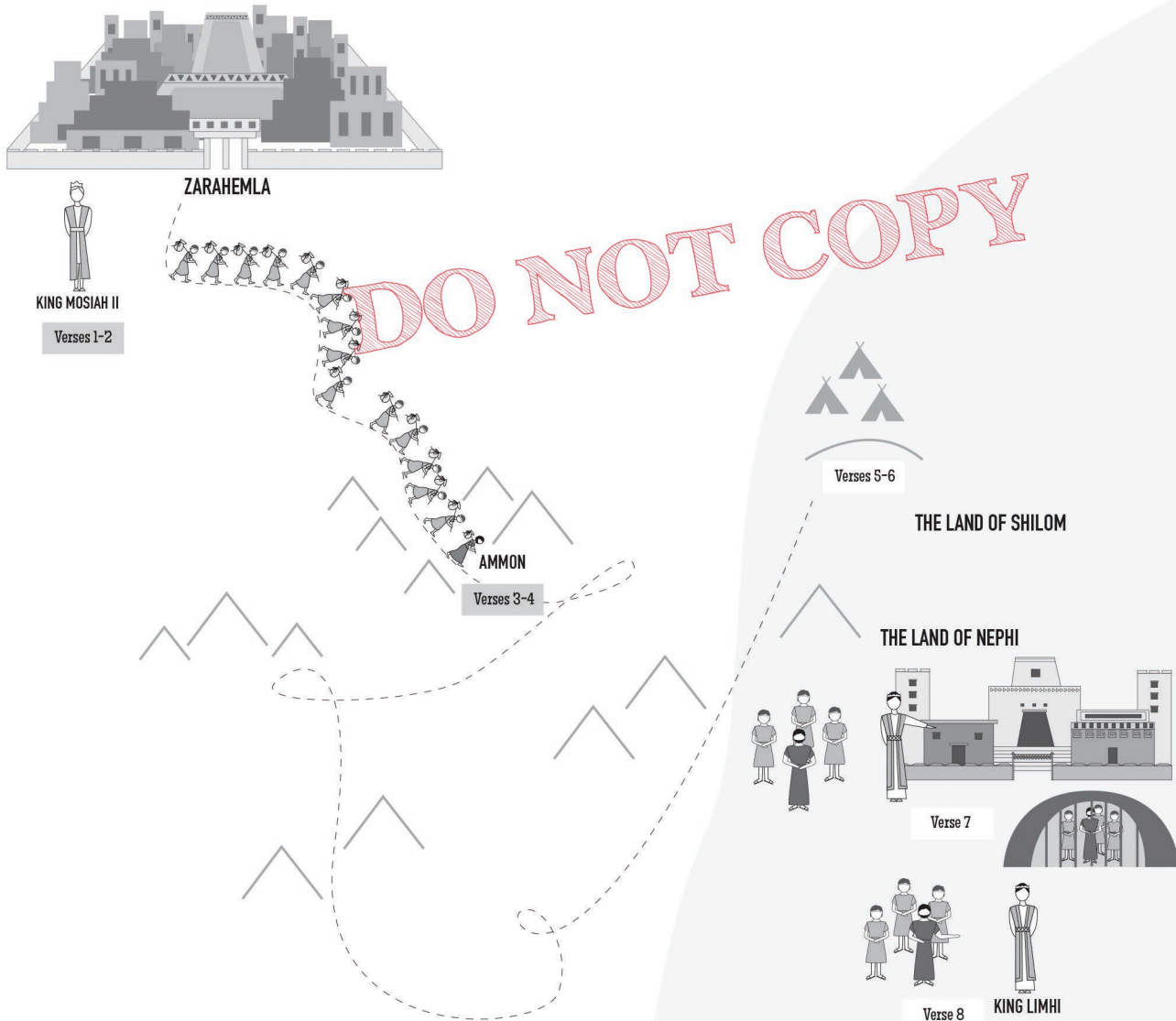



Title for this chapter

The Book of Mosiah can be confusing because it jumps back and forth to different time periods. Years before this point in King Mosiah II's life (2 generations before him), there was a group of Nephites who had left Zarahemla with the hopes of regaining the land of their fathers (the Land of Nephi). A man named Zeniff led them. That group of Nephites had not been heard of since, and King Mosiah II was concerned with their whereabouts and well-being, so he sent a search party to find them. Mosiah 7-8 is the journey of this group finding those lost Nephites. Mosiah 9-24 is the story of the Lost Nephites and what had happened once they left Zarahemla.
